



21st MADIS HABAKUK CUP by EBS

Venue: Estonian Golf & Country Club (EGCC), Sea Course, 18 holes

Competition date and format: Madis Day – Monday, 21 September, shotgun start at 1:00 PM

Format of play: Team Stroke Play – Florida Scramble

Competition category: Team competition (single category)

Tees: Men play from the yellow tees, women from the red tees.

Eligibility: The competition is open to students of the EBS Education Group, university students and alumni, faculty members, visiting lecturers, current and former employees, as well as invited EBS guests together with their family members.

Rules:

All members of the team play their tee shot. The best ball is selected, after which all players continue play from the position of the selected ball, except that in a four-player team the player whose ball was selected does not play the next stroke.

In a four-player team, the player whose ball was selected skips the next stroke.

In a three-player team, no player skips a stroke; the player whose ball was selected also plays the next stroke.

Play continues in the same manner until the ball is holed.

In a four-player team, each player must contribute at least **4 selected tee shots**.

In a three-player team, each player must contribute at least **5 selected tee shots**.

The competition is played as gross stroke play. Handicaps (HCP) will not be taken into account in the final results.



Formation of Starting Groups

The organiser, Estonian Business School, aims to create teams with players of different handicap levels in order to encourage networking and business relationships within the EBS community.

To achieve this, the organiser will form the starting groups according to the following principles:

Registered players will be divided into four handicap groups based on their HCP for the purpose of creating the starting list, and one player from each handicap group will be randomly assigned to each team by the organiser. Teams may consist of either three or four players.

Team compositions will be announced approximately 24 hours before the start of the competition, and the starting list will be published no later than 12:00 on 20 September.

The competition will be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf approved by The R&A St Andrews, the Local Rules of EGCC, and these Competition Regulations.

Ties: In the event of a tie, the results of the last 9 holes will be compared. If still tied, the last 6 holes will be compared, followed by the last 3 holes, and finally the last hole. If the teams remain tied after these comparisons, the winning team will be determined by drawing lots.

Prize Ceremony: Prizes will be awarded to the three best-performing teams. The names of the members of the winning team will be engraved on the EBS Alumni Golf Trophy.

Entry Fee: €149 per player, €99 for players with EGCC playing rights. The entry fee for current EBS pupils and university students is €69. The entry fee includes the green fee, practice balls, and the post-competition dinner.

It is a tradition of the Madis Habakuk Cup that participants donate raffle prizes (this year both for the raffle and the charity auction), while companies donating prizes have the opportunity to introduce their company during the post-competition dinner.

Guests are also welcome to attend the post-competition dinner. The dinner fee for accompanying guests is €59 (free of charge for children aged 12 and under).



As a new addition this year, the post-competition dinner will feature a charity auction. The proceeds of the auction will support the activities of the EBS Impact Fund (MTÜ EBS Mõjufond).
